Sunday 16th September Flamborough Head with Paul Hildreth

Detailed look at the litho- and biostratigraphy of part of the Flamborough Chalk (some of the highest beds of the Chalk Group in northern England) including the Flamborough Sponge Bed. We shall also look at Quaternary deposits and features at Danes Dyke and, if time and tides permit, Lamplugh's buried cliff section at Sewerby. Meet 1015 at Danes Dyke Car Park off the Bridlington to Flamborough road but **DO NOT PAY FOR PARKING** until all assembled – we plan to deploy some cars to Sewerby to convey the group members back to Danes Dyke at the end of the walk. Finish 1430. Mostly on boulder-covered wave-cut platform accessed from Danes Dyke ravine. We will walk from Danes Dyke to Sewerby leaving the shore via steps to the previously deployed cars which will ferry members to Danes Dyke. There is a café at Danes Dyke.
